

I have known Dr. Khaled Abbas for several years, since he joined the Egyptian National Institute of Transport (ENIT) in 1986. Towards the end of 1986 Dr. Abbas was awarded a British Overseas Development Administration Study Fellowship to undertake his M.Sc. and Ph.D. studies in the field of Transportation Engineering and Operations at the University of Newcastle upon Tyne in the UK. I followed his progress news during his M.Sc. and Ph.D. studies in the U.K. After successfully completing his Ph.D. degree he returned to Egypt in 1991 to join ENIT as an Assistant Professor at the Transportation Planning Department and a colleague.

In his first year of teaching he became responsible for teaching three postgraduate Diploma courses namely: Transportation Planning, Road Transport Technology and Information Systems. He participates in teaching several training courses and supervises Diploma dissertations covering various topics related to the field of transport. He has also been seconded to teach Operations Research to final year cadets at the Egyptian Military College.

Recently, Dr. Abbas played a key role in the restructuring of the Diploma offered by ENIT. As a result of this restructuring, this Diploma became accredited by the University of Westminster in the UK. Dr. Abbas is currently a module leader for three courses namely Transport Policy and Planning, Transport Policy and Planning at an Organisation Level and Research Methodologies.

Dr. Abbas research achievements is well in evidence. He has several excellent publications in international journals and conferences. In his papers he has tackled a wide variety of transport research topics. His papers reflect a significant research effort and depict relevant scientific and technical skills, and a strong knowledge of the transport field. He addresses his research problems in an enthusiastic, professional and sound manner. His eagerness to get acquainted with the latest research in his field and to develop and apply it is well in evidence.

One of his papers that was published in the Transportation Research Journal addresses the potential applicability of System Dynamics to transportation Modelling. Dr. Abbas has a genuine interest and a record of accomplishment both in his Ph.D. thesis as well as in his research activities to develop generic transportation models using the systems approach that can act as Decision Support Systems to the transport profession.

Dr. Abbas is a cooperative, well known transport academic in Egypt. He initiated several joint research work with other transport academics at the Departments of Civil Engineering in Cairo, Ain Shams and Al-Azhar Universities. He is often selected by local and international consultants as an expert in the field of transportation planning and management. 

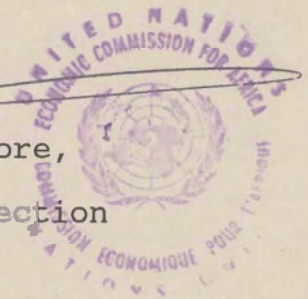
